

## FACILITIES UNIT LEADER (NQS)

<b>RESOURCE CATEGORY</b>	Logistics and Transportation
<b>RESOURCE KIND</b>	Personnel
<b>OVERALL FUNCTION</b>	The Facilities Unit Leader oversees unit staff who set up, maintain and demobilize all facilities used in support of incident operations and who provide facility maintenance and law enforcement/security services necessary for incident support.
<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. This position can be ordered as a single resource.</li> <li>2. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation and meals, prior to deployment.</li> <li>3. Requestor specifies any additional qualifications necessary, based on incident complexity and needs.</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

Configures unit with personnel to support operations</li> <li>3. Coordinates the setup, maintenance and demobilization of all incident facilities</li> <li>4. Coordinates and oversees support services for incident facilities, such as: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Maintenance</li> <li>b. Security services</li> <li>c. Communications</li> <li>d. Supplies</li> <li>e. Food and beverage</li> </ol> </li> <li>5. Manages base and camp operations</li> </ol>	Not Specified

<b>TRAINING</b>	<p>Completion of the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. IS-100: Introduction to the Incident Command System, ICS-100</li> <li>2. IS-200: Basic Incident Command System for Initial Response, ICS-200</li> <li>3. ICS-300: Intermediate Incident Command System for Expanding Incidents</li> <li>4. IS-700: National Incident Management System, An Introduction</li> <li>5. IS-800: National Response Framework, An Introduction</li> <li>6. <b>EXPERIENCE</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Successful completion of the National Qualification System (NQS) Position Task Book (PTB) for the National Incident Management System (NIMS) Facilities Unit Leader, or equivalent Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) documentation</li> <li>2. Leadership experience in incident management in a subordinate position, with an emphasis in facilities management</li> </ol>	Not Specified

<b>PHYSICAL/MEDICAL FITNESS</b>	Light	The NIMS Guideline for the NQS defines Physical/Medical Fitness levels for NQS positions.
<b>CURRENCY</b>	Functions in this position or a higher position during a qualifying incident, planned event, exercise, drill or simulation at least once every five years	A higher position is one for which this position is a prerequisite.
