<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	1. This position can be ordered as a single resource or in conjunction with a NIMS typed team (Public Health and Medical Systems Assessment Team). 2. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment

<b>CURRENCY</b>	1. Functions as a team leader, within the medical or public health field, during an operational incident, planned event, exercise, drill, or simulation at least once every two years 2. Background checks as applicable law permits or requires	Provider must carry out and use any background checks as applicable law specifies. This may include a background check completed within past 12 months; sex-offender registry check; and a local, state, and a local, state, and national criminal history.
