OVERALL FUNCTION	The Fatality Management (FM) Morgue Fingerprint Specialist oversees the postmortem fingerprinting function at the temporary morgue and may serve as lead for the Fingerprint Station

This position can be ordered as a single resource or in conjunction with a NIMS typed team (Fatality Management Morgue Forensic Team). 2. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment

Obtains all available ridge detail impressions, or other comparable material, for comparative purposes 3. Maintains log of prints for each morgue reference number (MRN) 4. Provides guidance and instruction to fingerprint personnel from local departments involved in field investigations 5. Coordinates information obtained with FM Morgue Identification Center Fingerprint Analyst 6. Reports directly to the FM Morgue Forensic Team Leader 	Not Specified
