

## FATALITY MANAGEMENT HUMAN REMAINS STORAGE AND RELEASE SPECIALIST

<b>RESOURCE CATEGORY</b>	Medical and Public Health
<b>RESOURCE KIND</b>	Personnel
<b>OVERALL FUNCTION</b>	The Fatality Management (FM) Human Remains Storage and Release Specialist is responsible for storing, protecting, and preserving the human remains for subsequent examination, identification, and release of the deceased to the family
<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. This position can be ordered as a single resource.</li> <li>2. This position can be ordered with a NIMS typed unit (Fatality Management Morgue Processing Unit).</li> <li>3. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	Same as Type 2, PLUS: Performs duties with decedents or within areas exposed to hazardous materials	<p>The FM Human Remains Storage and Release Specialist:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Receives and logs human remains transported from the disaster site</li> <li>2. Stores human remains in refrigerated units until release for processing through the morgue</li> <li>3. Serves as Lead overseeing the receipt and storage of human remains received from the disaster site and upon completion of temporary morgue processing</li> <li>4. Coordinates with the FM Morgue Processing Unit Leader, Medical Examiner, or Coroner to determine human remains storage requirements and the appropriate methods for documentation and storage of human remains</li> <li>5. Ensures maintenance of all logs and forms for received and released human remains</li> <li>6. Maintains security and control over human remains from time of receipt until release to designated funeral service provider or other designee</li> <li>7. Ensures a sufficient supply of refrigerated units through coordination with FM Disaster Portable Morgue Unit (DPMU) Leader</li> <li>8. Ensures systematic release of human remains, with proper records in accordance with the Medical Examiner's or Coroner's designated procedures</li> <li>9. Reports directly to the FM Morgue Processing Unit Leader</li> </ol>	Not Specified
