

## INTELLIGENCE/INVESTIGATIONS SECTION CHIEF (NQS)

<b>RESOURCE CATEGORY</b>	Incident Management
<b>RESOURCE KIND</b>	Personnel
<b>OVERALL FUNCTION</b>	The Intelligence/Investigations (I/I) Section Chief coordinates intelligence and investigation efforts
<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. This position can be ordered as a single resource.</li> <li>2. Requestor specifies any additional qualifications or security clearance necessary based on incident complexity and needs</li> <li>3. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

Ensures use of appropriate protocols for handling sensitive or classified information 5. Supervises and configures section to support operations with branches, divisions, and groups as necessary	Not Specified
