<b>RESOURCE CATEGORY</b>	Fire/Hazardous Materials
<b>RESOURCE KIND</b>	Personnel
<b>OVERALL FUNCTION</b>	The Fire Officer provides supervisory and managerial functions for a group of firefighters
<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. This position can be ordered as a single resource or in conjunction with a National Incident Management System (NIMS) typed team (Fire Engine Strike Team -Structural)</li> <li>2. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment</li> <li>3. Requestor specifies any additional qualifications necessary based on incident complexity</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.
