This position can be ordered as a single resource or in conjunction with a NIMS typed team (Disaster Cost Recovery Management Team). 2. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment 3. This position typically works 12 hours per shift, is self-sustainable for 72 hours, and is deployable for up to 14 days

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

Coordinates with the Disaster Recovery Finance Specialists to ensure complete transfer of data regarding damages and dimension, scopes of work, estimated cost of repairs, and copies of the Applicant's procurement policy for funding streams, such as insurance, FEMA Public Assistance, Federal Transit Administration Emergency Relief Program, Federal Highway Administration Emergency Relief Program, Community Development Block Grants - Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR), and other federal, state, tribal, territorial, and local programs 	Not Specified
