

## GROUND SUPPORT UNIT LEADER (NQS)

<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. This position can be ordered as a single resource.</li> <li>2. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment</li> <li>3. This position typically works 12 hours per shift, is self-sustainable for 72 hours, and is deployable for up to 14 days</li> <li>4. Requestor may specify any additional qualifications necessary based on incident complexity and needs</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	<p>The Ground Support Unit Leader:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Plans, staffs, and manages the Ground Support Unit to meet the incident's needs safely</li> <li>2. Coordinates with the Logistics Section and other sections to help meet the incident's overall objectives</li> <li>3. Manages support for out-of-service resources; transportation for personnel, supplies, food, and equipment; fueling, service, maintenance, and repair for vehicles and other ground support equipment; and development and implementation of the incident transportation plan</li> <li>4. Establishes or transitions into a unit under the Logistics Section</li> <li>5. Configures unit with personnel to support operations</li> </ol>	Not Specified
