<b>OVERALL FUNCTION</b>	The Medical/Public Health Shelter Team Leader coordinates all medical and public health activities for congregate shelters
<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. This position can be ordered as a single resource.</li> <li>2. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment</li> </ol>

This includes the implementation of plans, policies, and procedures for provision of primary and secondary preventative care of mass shelter community and the supervision of community health assessment (initial and ongoing) in mass shelters and the integration of team operations into the mass care site.
