

## FATALITY MANAGEMENT DISASTER PORTABLE MORGUE UNIT LEADER (NQS)

<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. This position can be ordered as a single resource.</li> <li>2. This position can be ordered with a NIMS typed unit (Fatality Management Disaster Portable Morgue Unit).</li> <li>3. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment</li> <li>4. This position typically works 12 hours per shift, is self-sustainable for 72 hours, and is deployable for up to 14 days</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	<p>The Fatality Management (FM) Disaster Portable Morgue Unit (DPMU) Leader reports to the Mass Fatality Management Group Supervisor or designee and:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Manages DPMU personnel</li> <li>2. Maintains and assembles equipment</li> <li>3. Coordinates facility issues, such as transportation, food services, communications, Information Technology (IT) support, and medical services for DPMU members</li> <li>4. Ensures resources are in place for security around the DPMU</li> <li>5. Monitors DPMU personnel for physical, emotional, and psychological fatigue</li> <li>6. Establishes and maintains liaison with assigned channels for logistical support</li> <li>7. Coordinates DPMU efforts as necessary for the EOC, Mass Fatality Management Group, FM Assessment Team, FM Human Remains Recovery Team, Morgue Identification Center (MIC), Victim Information Center (VIC), and Family Assistance Center (FAC)</li> <li>8. Acts as liaison or assigns person to interface with Public Information Officer (PIO) or Joint Information Center (JIC)</li> </ol>	Not Specified
<b>EDUCATION</b>	Bachelor of science degree in criminal justice, science, or a public administration-related field	Four years of experience in a Medical Examiner/Coroner (ME/C) department directly related to the job description may substitute for a bachelor of science degree.
