This could include analysis of old plans, determining scope of new plans, providing training in HM Planning, on-site planning assistance, developing a local planning team and planning schedule, planning meetings, and undertaking research pertaining to the community's hazards, risk and vulnerability, identifying existing capabilities, and identifying loss-reduction opportunities and implementation strategies.
