This position can be ordered as a single resource or in conjunction with a NIMS typed team (Evacuation Coordination Team). 2. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment 3. The position typically works 12 hours per shift, is self-sustainable for 72 hours, and is deployable for up to 14 days

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

Coordinates with key local, regional, state, and Federal partners to establish and implement effective evacuation, shelter-in-place, and re-entry activities 3. Establishes, in coordination with members of the Evacuation Coordination Team, an evacuation strategy for impacted populations 4. Communicates evacuation strategies with Incident Commander (IC), Emergency Operations Center (EOC) manager, and other officials, in collaboration with transportation, emergency management, mass care, emergency assistance, housing, human services, logistics and resources, and public safety and security representatives 5. Coordinates basic mass care services, including accommodations for individuals with access and functional needs (AFN) 	Not Specified
