

## PUBLIC SAFETY TELECOMMUNICATOR I/II

<b>RESOURCE CATEGORY</b>	Fire/Hazardous Materials
<b>RESOURCE KIND</b>	Personnel
<b>OVERALL FUNCTION</b>	The Public Safety Telecommunicator I/II manages the flow of incident-related information to and from field units or public safety resources, monitors status of field units, and assigns additional resources, as necessary
<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. This position can be ordered as a single resource.</li> <li>2. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment</li> <li>3. This position typically works 12 hours per shift, is self-sustainable for 72 hours, and is deployable for up to 14 days</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

NFPA 1061 or Association of Public Safety Communications Officials (APCO) equivalent</li> </ol> <p>Completion of the following baseline criteria:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Public Safety Telecommunicator I/II courses or equivalent</li> <li>2. Receiving Information</li> <li>3. Processing Information</li> <li>4. <b>EXPERIENCE</b>	Recommended: Two years of public safety dispatch (including fire incident) experience as determined by the AHJ	Where applicable, experience is measured from the time an individual receives necessary certifications.
