<b>OVERALL FUNCTION</b>	
<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. This position can be ordered in conjunction with a NIMS typed team (Patrol Team).</li> <li>2. Discuss logistics for deploying this team, such as security, communications, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment</li> <li>3. This position typically works 12 hours per shift, is self-sustainable for 12 hours, and is deployable for up to 7 days</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	<p>A Patrol Team Officer is a trained, sworn, and certified law enforcement officer assigned to a specific agency or regional resource as a patrol officer and:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Reports to a Patrol Team Supervisor</li> <li>2. Prevents, deters, and detects crime</li> <li>3. Renders law enforcement assistance</li> <li>4. Responds to calls for service</li> <li>5. Promotes traffic safety</li> <li>6. Promotes peace and civil order</li> <li>7. Arrests violators</li> <li>8. Transports prisoners</li> </ol>	Not Specified
<b>EDUCATION</b>	Law enforcement education and training that provides the core knowledge, skills, proficiency, and ability and meets the minimum requirements for employment as a sworn law enforcement officer	Not Specified
<b>TRAINING</b>	<p>Completion of the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. IS-100: Introduction to the Incident Command System, ICS-100</li> <li>2. IS-200: Incident Command System for Single Resource and Initial Action Incidents</li> <li>3. IS-700: National Incident Management System, An Introduction</li> <li>4. Additional training, which may include: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. High-Risk Patrol Operational Tactics</li> <li>b. Deployment of Less-Lethal Weapons</li> <li>c. Deployment of Chemical Agents and Munitions</li> <li>d. Crowd Control</li> </ol> </li> </ol>	Not Specified
<b>EXPERIENCE</b>	Non-probationary, entry-level law enforcement officer with one year of service	Not Specified
<b>PHYSICAL/MEDICAL FITNESS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Performs duties under arduous circumstances characterized by working consecutive 12-hour days under physical and emotional stress for sustained periods of time</li> <li>2. Ability to work wearing appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)</li> </ol>	PPE is mission specific and may vary by work environment; it includes protective footwear, protective clothing for skin exposure, eye and ear protection, respirators, gloves, and masks.
