

## ASSISTANT PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR - OPERATIONS

<b>RESOURCE CATEGORY</b>	Public Works
<b>RESOURCE KIND</b>	Personnel
<b>OVERALL FUNCTION</b>	The Assistant Public Works Director - Operations assists the Public Works Director with the operational requirements
<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. This position can be ordered as a single resource.</li> <li>2. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment</li> <li>3. This position typically works 12 hours per shift, is self-sustainable for 72 hours, and is deployable for up to 14 days</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	The Assistant Public Works Director - Operations assists the Public Works Director with the operational requirements for the preservation and restoration of lifelines during an emergency situation. This position may be in the Incident Command, a Branch, Division, Group, Strike Team, or Task Force, based upon mission-specific activities and needs.	Not Specified
