This position can be ordered as a single resource or in conjunction with a NIMS typed team (Public Works Support Team).</li> <li>2. Discuss logistics for deploying this team, such as security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment</li> <li>3. This team typically works 12 hours per shift, is self-sustainable for 72 hours, and is deployable for up to 14 days</li> <li>4. Requestor specifies field or Emergency Operations Center working environments</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.
