OVERALL FUNCTION	The Access and Functional Needs (AFN) Advisor supports and assists incident management personnel on matters related to people with disabilities and AFN
COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. This position can be ordered as a single resource. 2. Requestor may specify any additional qualifications necessary based on incident complexity and needs 3. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation and meals, prior to deployment 4. The position typically works 12 hours per shift, is self-sustainable for 72 hours and is deployable up to 14 days

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

Supports and assists state, local, tribal and territorial agencies' incident management personnel on issues related to people with disabilities and AFN 2. Advises incident leadership on physical access, effective communication access and programmatic access 3. Coordinates with subject matter experts (SME), the Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ), voluntary agencies, community groups and nongovernmental organizations (NGO) and makes equal access and reasonable accommodation recommendations 4. Assists responders who are identifying and coordinating SMEs to help with resources and services, including accessible transportation resources, recovery assistance, search and rescue, public health, emergency messaging, emergency sheltering, feeding and accessible evacuation operations 5. Ensures facilities and services meet all accessibility requirements 	Not Specified
