

## HUMAN SERVICES RECOVERY SUPPORT TEAM

<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	The Human Services Recovery Support Team assists in providing services to disaster survivors, using identified needs from the Human Services Disaster Assessment Team's initial assessment.
<b>RESOURCE CATEGORY</b>	Emergency Management
<b>RESOURCE KIND</b>	Team
<b>OVERALL FUNCTION</b>	<p>The Human Services Recovery Support Team provides assistance to federal, state, tribal, territorial, and local emergency management agencies pertaining to claims for human services assistance, such as:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Housing assistance</li> <li>2. Disaster unemployment assistance</li> <li>3. Mass care services</li> <li>4. Other needs assistance</li> <li>5. Crisis counseling</li> <li>6. Disaster legal services</li> <li>7. Case management services</li> <li>8. Food assistance</li> </ol>
<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Discuss logistics for deploying this team, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment</li> <li>2. The requestor provides support to the team, such as security, fuel, and power for recharging phones, computers, and other rechargeable devices</li> <li>3 Requestor should specify the need for maps or telephone directories</li> <li>4. Requestor should request additional specialized personnel such as housing or legal specialists separately</li> <li>5. Requestor may order Recovery Support Function (RSF) Leads with this team, including RSF 3 Health and Social Services Recovery, RSF 4 Housing Recovery, and others as necessary</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

<b>PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE) EQUIPMENT PER TEAM MEMBER</b>	Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is mission-specific and may include: 1. Protective footwear 2. Protective clothing 3. Gloves 4. Masks 5. Eye protection 6. Respirators 7. Hearing protection	Not Specified
<b>GENERAL SUPPLIES PER TEAM</b>	1. Office supplies 2. Relevant human services reference materials and forms	Not Specified
