

## HUMAN SERVICES DISASTER ASSESSMENT TEAM

<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	The Human Services Disaster Assessment Team is responsible for post-disaster assessments of the needs of disaster survivors. The team also determines the need for a Human Services Recovery Support team to address the needs of disaster survivors during the recovery process.
<b>RESOURCE CATEGORY</b>	Emergency Management
<b>RESOURCE KIND</b>	Team
<b>OVERALL FUNCTION</b>	<p>The Human Services Disaster Assessment Team assists in the assessment of disaster-caused human services needs, including:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Housing assistance</li> <li>2. Disaster unemployment assistance</li> <li>3. Crisis counseling services</li> <li>4. Disaster legal services</li> <li>5. Case management assistance</li> <li>6. Food assistance</li> <li>7. Need for disaster recovery center</li> <li>8. Staffing needs for human services assistance</li> <li>9. Need for Human Services Recovery Support Team</li> </ol>
<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Discuss logistics for deploying this team, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment</li> <li>2. The requestor provides support to the team, such as security, fuel, and power for recharging phones, computers, and other rechargeable devices</li> <li>3. Requestor may request additional specialized personnel, such as housing or legal specialists, separately</li> <li>4. Requestor may order Recovery Support Function (RSF) Leads with this team, including RSF 3 Health and Social Services Recovery, RSF 4 Housing Recovery, and others as necessary</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

<b>PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE) EQUIPMENT PER TEAM MEMBER</b>	Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is mission-specific and may include: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Protective footwear</li> <li>2. Protective clothing</li> <li>3. Gloves</li> <li>4. Masks</li> <li>5. Eye protection</li> <li>6. Respirators</li> <li>7. Hearing protection</li> </ol>	Not Specified
<b>COMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT PER TEAM</b>	4 - Two-way portable radios 4 - Cell phones	Consider alternate forms of communication, such as satellite phones, based on the mission assignment and team needs.
