<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	
<b>RESOURCE CATEGORY</b>	Medical and Public Health
<b>RESOURCE KIND</b>	Team
<b>OVERALL FUNCTION</b>	Defined inpatient general and specialty services in an existing hospital facility
<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Request for Mutual Aid should specify specialty services as needed</li> <li>2. Specialty care provided based on assessment of patient needs by the requesting state</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

<b>SURGICAL CAPABILITIES TEAM</b>	Same as Type 2	Core Surgical Team (ie 1 Medical Unit Team Leader, 2 surgeons, 1 anesthesiologist, 1 Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist, 6 surgical and/or perianesthesia nurses, 2 surgical technicians) Needs defined by the AHJ—in addition to advanced trauma care, specialty services must be specifically requested—may include but not limited to neurosurgical, orthopedic, ENT, cardiothoracic, vascular, and pediatrics)	Not Specified
