

DISASTER COST RECOVERY MANAGEMENT TEAM

DESCRIPTION	The Disaster Cost Recovery Management Team assists on disaster assessment and expense reimbursement pertaining to damage, emergency protective measures, and debris management for disaster recovery funding streams, such as insurance, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Public Assistance, Federal Transit Administration Emergency Relief Program, Federal Highway Administration Emergency Relief Program, Community Development Block Grants - Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR), and other Federal, state, tribal, territorial, and local programs. This team coordinates with and continues the National Incident Management System (NIMS) 508: Rapid Needs Assessment (RNA) Team's initial operations.

OVERALL FUNCTION	The Disaster Cost Recovery Management Team assists in the post-RNA assessment and supports elements of disaster recovery needs and may interface with Federal, state, tribal, territorial, and local operations.	COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS	1. Discuss logistics for deploying this team, such as security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment 2. This team typically works 12 hours per shift, is self-sustainable for 72 hours, and is deployable up to 14 days 3. Requestor may need to order hazard-specific specialists as single resources to supplement the team based on the incident, such as insurance, FEMA Public Assistance, or CDBG-DR specialists
