

## INTERAGENCY BUYING TEAM – FIREFIGHTING (NEW)

<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	The Interagency Buying Team - Firefighting supports incident acquisition through coordination with the incident agency administrative staff by procuring services and supplies or renting land and equipment
<b>RESOURCE CATEGORY</b>	Fire/Hazardous Materials
<b>RESOURCE KIND</b>	Team
<b>OVERALL FUNCTION</b>	<p>The Interagency Buying Team - Firefighting:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Supports incident acquisition through coordination with the incident agency administrative staff or local administrative staff</li> <li>2. Establishes procedures for filling and documenting resource orders for services, supplies, and equipment from the open market and established sources</li> <li>3. Ensures goods and services are purchased in accordance with incident agency policy</li> <li>4. Implements the administrative unit's and geographic area's acquisition policies, operating guidelines, and service and supply plan</li> </ol>
<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Discuss logistics for deploying this team, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment</li> <li>2. Discuss the number of hours the team can operate and the number of operation days prior to deployment</li> <li>3. Interagency Buying Teams, Firefighting should not be utilized as payment teams. Incident agencies should order an Administrative Payment Team if the incident requires payment team support</li> <li>4. Geographic areas may have additional Interagency Buying Teams, Firefighting for use within the area. Geographic area teams may differ in team composition and can employ three to five members</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

<b>MANAGEMENT AND OVERSIGHT PERSONNEL PER TEAM</b>	1 - Team Leader	Not Specified
<b>SUPPORT PERSONNEL PER TEAM</b>	2 - Team Members	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. One of the three team members may be assigned as an assistant or deputy team leader</li> <li>2. One member shall have delegation of procurement authority</li> <li>3. Personnel from the Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) or alternate buying team members may be added, as needed, to supplement the primary team</li> </ol>
<b>GENERAL EQUIPMENT PER TEAM</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Internet/Intranet website references</li> <li>2. Laptop with spreadsheets and frequently used forms and/or URLs</li> <li>3. Copier, scanner and printer with toner and paper</li> <li>4. Cell phones</li> </ol>	Not Specified
