DESCRIPTION	The Mass Evacuee Support Task Force provides technical and functional expertise for the registration, tracking, movement, and needs of disaster survivors at a mass evacuee support site.

Supports the registration of disaster survivors at a mass evacuee support site, using the systems and processes the Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) specifies 2. Supports the training of assigned registration or tracking personnel at a mass evacuee support site 3. Coordinates with other support teams, task forces, and single resources a mass evacuee support site in the following key areas: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Food and hydration delivery b. Health, behavioral health, and personal assistance services c. Disaster survivors with disabilities, access, and functional support needs d. Unaccompanied minors e. Household pets and service and assistance animals 	COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Discuss logistics for this team, such as security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment 2. The team typically works 12 hours per shift, is self-sustainable for 72 hours, and is deployable for up to 14 days 3. The requestor provides equipment and supplies (such as evacuee wristbands, labels, and forms) based on the number of anticipated evacuees per mass evacuation support site 4. The requestor may deploy the team to an embarkation, reception processing, or debarkation site
